11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was set up on 25 November 2015 as an initiative for assessment of the academic quality of the college and ensuring qualitative initiatives to improve policies, processes to impart quality education to the students at college. Some of the significant contribution made by IAQAC of the college are as follows: IQAC contributed towards making the process of promotion of faculty members smooth and helped us in achieving promotions of many colleagues, including six to the level of professors.

IQAC took measures to strengthen the college alumni base. The college and various departments approached alumni, consolidated their data and successfully conducted Alumni Meets.

IQAC proposed and facilitated the formation of Research Cell to promote research culture among faculty members and provide incentives to publish their work in academic journals of repute. The library has also allocated a dedicated research room for this purpose with many facilities to enhance research work.

The IQAC, in collaboration with different departments, organized various seminars, webinars, and student certificate courses such as "The Indian Contract Act-1872 & Remedies for Breach of Contract" a

short-term certificate course by department of commerce held from 16th January to 3rd February 2023

Placement cell in association with IQAC organized the second edition of the 'Career Readiness Boot Camp' from 6th February 2023 to 16th February 2023 to keep students ahead of the learning curve.

15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Proposed by NEP, PGDAV College approaches all of its activities with an interdisciplinary perspective. In order to fulfil the goals of NEP, faculty members have actively engaged in the development, reorganisation, and enhancement of the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) and have embraced multidisciplinary teaching practise. The University of Delhi's UGCF has made it easy for students to enter and abandon courses on many occasions. It is now forming a task force to carry out the NEP in letter and spirit, with the goal of establishing a guiding cell to advise students about the courses provided by the UGCF. Operating within the current CBCS-LOCF curriculum, PGDAV College gives students freedom by allowing them to choose allied courses under the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) programme. Students may choose two courses under General Elective (GE) that are not required core courses in their field of study. Furthermore, students choose to enrol in Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs), which facilitate experiential learning by organising community service projects and environmental education. SECs also help students get ready for research projects, internships, and apprenticeships. Encouraging multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary study, PGDAV college fosters multiplicity of perspectives. Departments have invited guest speakers from a range of disciplines outside of their own in the past and present. Talks like this are meant to inspire students to examine the same problem from different angles. These discussions are available to all college students, allowing students from all fields to exchange perspectives. Furthermore, the Department of Economics conducted a 21-day, multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary Short Term Certificate Course on data "Analysing Using R" in February 2023. Participants came from a variety of fields, including Statistics, Economics, Mathematics, and so forth. PGDAV College's short-term courses bring together students from a variety of academic backgrounds.

Future Academic Meets, seminars, and presentations of this like are being planned; in particular, ones that address the ways in which interdisciplinary research may be utilised to promote constructive social change in a society that is changing quickly. The college intends to improve the above-mentioned best practises for interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary teamwork and match it with NEP

objectives.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) was introduced in July 2021. was part of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The ABC was introduced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The University Grant Commission (UGC) issued the University Grant Commission Regulations, 2021. For the Establishment and Operation of the Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education. The Academic Bank of Credit is a transformative concept that aims to provide students with more flexibility in their education. It operates on a credit-based system, allowing students to accumulate academic credits that can be transferred and recognized by various educational institutions. This innovative approach empowers students and assists institutions in meeting the evolving quality standards set by NAAC. Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) allows students to choose courses from different institutions, fostering a dynamic learning experience. The credit system enables the seamless transfer of credits earned by students. NAAC values the ease with which students can move between institutions while retaining the value of their earned credits. Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) acknowledges and values prior learning experiences. This recognition aligns with NAAC's appreciation for institutions catering to their students' diverse educational backgrounds. Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) promotes lifelong learning, which is a key aspect of NAAC's vision for institutions. Encouraging students to continuously update their skills and knowledge reflects positively on an institution's accreditation process. Delhi University (DU) has made it mandatory for students who enrol in DU from the 2022-23 academic session onwards to register for the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) portal. PGDAV College, an integral part of the University of Delhi, is fully dedicated to adhering to the precise protocols and regulations of the Academic Bank of Credits framework. PGDAV College implemented Multiple Entry/Exit as per Delhi University guidelines. Exit after 1-year (44 credits) students will get an Under Graduate Certificate. Exit after 2 years (88 credits) students will get an Under Graduate Diploma. Exit after 3 years (132 credits) students will get a Bachelor of (field of study) (Hons). Exit after 4 years (176 credits)) students will get the degree of Bachelor of (field of study)(Hons with Research).

17.Skill development:

Skill development is the process of acquiring and enhancing the skills, knowledge, competencies, and abilities necessary to perform specific tasks or functions effectively. It is a critical aspect of

personal and professional growth, education, and workforce preparation.

PGDAV College Aligned with the National Education Policy, PGDAV College has been proactively involved in enhancing students' skill sets through workshops, and certificate programs, enriching the curriculum, and offering diverse electives.

The 2022-23 session of Diligentia The Entrepreneurship Cell started with a 7-day Bootcamp session named 'E-Skills with E-cell' from 1st to 7th July 2022. More than one hundred fifty students participated in this 7-day skill learning session, gained knowledge and skills, and were awarded the certificate after a test. Diligentia conducted a Project named 'Surbhi'. The members of the society sold glass jar candles of various fragrances like vanilla, orange, lemongrass and rose. The students of the society sold more than three hundred pieces of glass jar candles in various markets of New Delhi like Khan Market and Connaught Place where people appreciated the efforts and the socio-entrepreneurial spirit and purpose of the project.

Placement Cell, in association with IQAC P.G.D.A.V. 'organized the second edition of the 'Career Readiness Boot Camp' from 6th February 2023 to 16th February 2023' which was an eleven-day workshop where more than hundred and thirty students successfully completed an all-inclusive soft skills training programme. Department of Commerce P.G.D.A.V. organised A short-term certificate course titled 'The Indian Contract Act-1872 & Remedies for Breach of Contract' held from 16th January to 3rd February 2023. A seminar on 'Financial Literacy Among India's Youth' was held on 23rd September 2022. A seminar on 'Risk Management' was held on 11th January, 2023.

Ecolibrium The Economics Society of PGDAV College organised an interesting session on Research Paper Writing on 3rd February 2023 to introduce students to research and to hone the art of writing and presenting research papers.

One-Day National Seminar The department also organised a one-day National Seminar in collaboration with ICHR and Akhil Bharatiya Itihas Sankalan Yojana on 22nd February 2023 on the topic 'Tomar evam Chauhan Rajvansh ke Antargat Gauravshali Dilli'.

One Day National Workshop on Vedic Mathematics was organised in collaboration with Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas on 30th August 2022. Eminent speakers from Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas like Dr. Rakesh Bhatia, Dr. Anil Thakur, and Dr. Deepak Vashishtha took very interactive sessions.

Parikalan The Department of Computer Science Society, conducted a Workshop on Advanced CSS, GitHub, Web Development, blockchain, etc, and a seminar on the 'Future of Tech'.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Integrating India's rich cultural and intellectual heritage into education through online courses is essential for its preservation and promotion. PGDAV Colleges play a crucial role in the integration of the Indian knowledge system into modern education. PGDAV College acts as a key driver in preserving and promoting India's rich cultural and intellectual heritage. Here are some of the essential roles that colleges play in this integration. North-East Cell (NEC) PGDAV college annual cultural festival called Heritage concluded on 24 April 2023 with our Author and Associate Professor of the Department of English, Dr. Veio Pou had a beautiful conversation with our students about the culture, literature, and history of North-East India.

N.S.S PGDAV College organized a 2-day yoga session on 'International Yoga Day'. First, the opening ceremony started with a Sanskrit shloka by the Acharya. He exquisitely explained every basic step of yoga particularly he emphasizes to do all the asanas without any mental stress. Its second day was inaugurated by our guest speaker Mr. ACHARYA NARENDRA- president of Swanubhuti and Yoga expert.

One Day National Workshop On Vedic Mathematics was organized by the Department of Mathematics, P.G.D.A.V. College (M) in collaboration with Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas on 30th August 2022. The workshop was organized on this useful and interesting topic at the time when Vedic Mathematics had become a part of the NEP syllabus. Teachers were trained and motivated for the forthcoming Vedic Mathematics VAC paper under UGCF 22/NEP 20.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

PGDAV College bases its education on student outcomes. An approach to education that is student-centered and concentrates on reaching particular learning outcomes that arise from dialogic instruction is known as outcome-based education in higher education institutions. The primary goals of the teaching-learning process at PGDAV College include helping students develop conceptual clarity; boosting their confidence and enthusiasm in the subject matter; and encouraging students' drive to learn and advance and achieving strong academic performance on tests and assignments. Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) courses offer students a great deal of

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opportunity to develop in terms of analytical abilities, creative thinking, and problem-solving skills. A range of skill-building courses are offered by the college as part of the LOCF project, which gives students more possibilities for employment. Several strategies are used to guarantee outcome-based education, including interactive classrooms, areas for questions to be answered, remedial classes, the use of IT resources like PowerPoint presentations, prompt distribution of books, and advice on how to get ready for exams. There are other resources available to help students achieve their objectives, like mental health services and grievance platforms, and these will be expanded as needed. Additionally, there are a lot of student events held at the institution all year long, including extracurricular and cocurricular pursuits run by student organisations and departmental organisations. By planning activities such as workshops, seminars, academic discussions, cultural programmes, and competitions, students get experience in leadership and teamwork. The college's placement cell introduces students to the placement preparation process through workshops and placement training activities. In the current academic year, Diligentia, the entrepreneurship cell of the college organised 7 days Bootcamp: E-Skills with E-cell in July with seven experts from different fields. An interview, Let's Taco About It: Fundamentals of Food Entrepreneurship was held in September. Three different Mentor speaks conducted on 30th August, 2022, 20th September, 2022 and 11th November, 2022 Projects - Surbhi and Prakriti along with Ebullient: E-Summit with E-cell organised by the students for showcasing their entrepreneurial skills. The college provides a practical approach to learning along with an environment that is conducive to research. College Library has a treasure trove of 1,03,907 books and 4534 bound volumes of Journals. A total of 1871 books worth Rs.14, 17,361.00 were purchased in this session. About 65 periodicals and 18 newspapers are regularly subscribed. College e- Library, a dedicated computer lab for the students of the college, is functioning to support the studies and maximize the use of eresources and facilitate internet browsing for academic purpose. The college library has rich book bank collection of 12497 books for needy.

20.Distance education/online education:

PGDAV College is preparing for a time when e-learning will be an important component of education. Teachers at the College are increasingly skilled in using online tools like Google Meet to conduct lessons. The usage of ICT (information and communication technology) by academics is growing (such as Power Point presentations and E-books). Teachers can use the 'share screening'

feature of online teaching platforms to project e-books into their classes. The college hosts a number of online lectures by eminent scholars of national and worldwide renown, webinars, short-term certificate courses, and faculty development programmes. A shortterm certificate course on "The Indian Contract Act-1872 & Remedies for Breach of Contract" was organised by the Department of Commerce and ran from January 16 to February 3, 2023. The Computer Science Department organized two days International Webinar titled 'Breakthroughs in Computer Science'. A 21-day, online, multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary Short Term Certificate Course in data Analysis Using "R" was offered by the Department of Economics in February 2023. In September 2022, Department of Political Science organised an online lecture by Dr. Rinku Lamba, Associate Professor, National Law School of India University, Bengaluru on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti. The department also organized an online lecture on 29 November 2022 by Prof. Anupama Roy on the topic "Constitutional moments in Indian Democracy". Similarly, using online platforms, the other departments arranged several webinars as well. The College e-Library is a dedicated computer facility for college students that supports their studies, helps them make the most of their e-resources, and makes it easier for them to browse the internet for educational purposes. The majority of e-books and ejournals are available through N LIST resources, to which PGDAV College is the subscriber. PGDAV College functions as a study centre for postgraduate courses offered by Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU). The college additionally acts as a study space for undergraduate courses offered by the University of Delhi's School of Open Learning (SOL) and Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB). Thus, especially in the framework of a hybrid model, the College feels adequately equipped to tackle the responsibility of providing online/distance education. Plans for the future involve bolstering College's digital infrastructure even more.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

P.G.D.A.V. College is a constituent college of University of Delhi and adheres to the curriculum specified by the university. As per the University guidelines New Education Policy has been implemented across all the courses from this academic session. Although Batches enrolled in 2020 and 2021 continues to follow the CBCS-LOCF curriculum.

To ensure an efficient curriculum delivery, each department plans and evaluates its workload in advance to determine the necessary guest faculty for the semester. The timetable committee then utilizes this workload to schedule all courses according to university guidelines, ensuring faculty members receive the required number of lectures to cover the curriculum effectively. The finalized timetables are made accessible to students and staff through the college website and notice board.

The forms for optional papers are provided on the college website

much before the start of the semester so that classes for the optional papers can start in accordance to the academic calendar provided by the university.

Teachers need to plan and share weekly lessons at the start of the semester. They regularly give students the necessary materials like notes, presentations, assignments, and references. The library is also equipped with a large number of reference materials and various e-subscriptions to help the students with the curriculum and the course. Extra classes are held for students who struggle, and there's a mentor system for any issues, with a list on the notice board for students to see.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

P.G.D.A.V. being the constituent college of University of Delhi, follows the Academic Calendar issued by the University at the beginning of the academic year. The Academic Calendar provides the dates for the commencement of sessions, University examinations, holidays, etc. The College abides by the dates of examinations fixed by the University for the different Semesters. Vacations and session breaks are also mentioned in the Academic Calendar, especially for the benefit of outstation candidates. Teaching plans are adjusted according to the academic calendars for specific semesters. Teaching and evaluation sync with the Academic Calendar. Faculty members plan their lessons to ensure the timely completion of the syllabus.

The aim of CIE is to enhance the quality education among the students. Students are assessed on a continuous basis, through assignments, class- tests/ presentations/ projects/ viva etc. Students are notified in advance about assessment dates. If a student misses one for valid reasons, teachers may arrange a makeup. Once Internal Assessment Marks are compiled, they are shared with students. Discrepancies, if any, are sorted out. The Department Moderation Committee scrutinizes the IA scores, as per university guidelines. The finalized marks are then sent to the university well in time.

All faculty members constantly endeavor to walk an extra mile for weaker, physically challenged and needy students, helping them improve grades and overall understanding. Remedial Classes and Mentoring classes also enable the teachers to clarify doubts, pay individual attention to students and assess their progress.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Recognising the need for excellent infrastructure and physical facilities for an optimal teaching-learning environment, P.G.D.A.V. has a robust infrastructure for the holistic development of learners. The college is spread over 7.12 acres, the campus provides well-lit and well-ventilated, spacious classrooms, laboratories, and various other necessary amenities to enhance the educational experience of learners. The college has52 classrooms, 12 tutorial rooms, 6 computer labs with 200 LAN computers, and 2 seminar halls, new andold, having a seating capacity of 300 and 100 respectively. The college campus is Wi-Fi enabled, and 20 classrooms are fitted with projectors, ensuring a technology-driven learning process. The college has a medical room accessible to college staffand students, a staff room comprisesof small conference room and a locker room. For promoting the research and teaching-learning process, each department has its separate spacious departmental rooms equipped with locker facilities for faculty members. Ramps towards teaching blocks and canteen, wheelchairs, and accessible washrooms for differently abled students, exhibit the commitment of college towards inclusivity. Library has all updated reading software, catering to visually impaired students. The College has 120 laptops, 125 desktops, and aserver room with 20 CCTV cameras for various academic and administrative purposes.

This is particularly beneficial for accessing the e-resources available through several platforms. Faculty and students have free access to both conventional as well as electronic resources like the e-resources of DULS& N-LIST E-Resources etc. College exclusively subscribes to N LIST resources. This includes around 97000 e-books and 6000 e-journals which are accessible only to the students and faculty members of the college. The Delhi University Library

System also provides remote login facility to all the PG students, research Scholars and faculty members of the University.
