Why Archaeology?

Archaeology is an indispensable tool to understand the human past. Anyone interested in uncovering the processes of history in distant past is bound to be interested in archaeology. Archaeology is our only window to the pre-historic deep past where written sources are not available. Material remains unearthed by the archaeologist bring out mostly the history of the common folk whereas literary sources usually eulogize the elite in history.

If history is both science and art, archaeology is a pure science using techniques and methods derived from various branches of science. In the last couple of centuries, the discipline of archaeology has evolved to incorporate latest scientific and technological developments in its tool kit. To young students, it offers exciting learning opportunities and a promising career. An archaeologist's life is full of adventure, always about to stumble upon a new discovery that might change the understanding of our past.

Why this course?

There is hardly any course available in India which gives a feel of field archaeology and its methods at the undergraduate level. While introducing the subject, this course has been designed to go beyond bookish knowledge. It focusses on archaeology as a source of history, its recent methods and analysis of archaeological data. A salient feature of this course is that it will be taught by eminent archaeologists who will share their field experience.

Course Objectives

- A basic introduction to different aspects of archaeology
- Understanding of the latest methodologies, developments and discussions in this field
- Practical aspects of the field archaeology through the experience of wellknown archaeologists
- Glimpses of reconstruction of history using archaeological data
- In-depth exposure to prospects in higher education and career in archaeology.

Course overview

This course systematically explores the origin and development of archaeology in India, synthesis of sources, discovery and formation process of archaeological sites, the methods and tools used in field work, practical aspects of the exploration and excavation, classification of data, contextual archaeology, use of archaeological data in history writing and recent perspectives of Indian archaeology.

Data Analysis using R

We are pleased to inform you that the Department of Economics and the IQAC, P. G. D. A. V. College, is organizing a short-term Certificate Course on 'Data Analysis using R' from 12th April to 29th April 2022.

R is an open-source programming language and software environment used for statistical analysis, data modelling, graphical representation and reporting. R is best tool for software programmers, statisticians and data miners who are looking forward to easily manipulate and present data in compelling ways. R has gained wide acceptance as a reliable and powerful modern computational environment for statistical computing and visualisation, and is now used in many areas of scientific computation. R is a modern, functional programming language that allows for rapid development of ideas, together with object-oriented features for rigorous software development.

This certificate course has been designed for beginners who have no prior knowledge about R. We will start with R's basics and slowly build upon that. We will use the RStudio, an integrated development environment (IDE) for R. Participants will learn how to manage large datasets, clean and visualize data, do econometric and statistical analysis of datasets. In a world where data is being touted as the new oil, an introductory course on data analysis will enhance the participants' skill sets.

Broadly, the topics which will be covered in this course are:

- How to install R and Rstudio.
- How to use Rstudio for writing codes, different panes of Rstudio, their uses.
- Working directory and setting of the working directory. Errors and warnings.
- How to save a .R file.
- How to open and run an R script.
- Installing packages tidyverse, ggplot2 etc.
- How to import data from .csv files, excel files.
- The steps one must follow after importing a dataset.

- str(), dim(), head(), tail(), view(), summary() commands
- Different types of objects. Basic calculations and objects. Vectors. Special types of vectors. Naming and indexing vectors. Matrices. Lists.
- Different types of data and variables. Numerical, integer, double, character, factor. How to deal with factors.
- Doing simple operations with data. How to find out mean, median etc. The use of the summary command.
- Dataframe. Subsets of data. R data files. Import and export text files and other files.
- Naming rows/columns of a matrix, dataframe. How to change the names of rows and columns.
 Subsetting from a matrix, dataframe. Use of the [] (square bracket). Filtering data from a matrix, dataframe.
- Operations with vectors, matrix, dataframes sum, addition, etc.
- Basic graphics.
- Plots histogram, barplot, boxplot, scatter diagram
- Use of the library command
- Filtering by using the packages in tidyverse like dplyr. The use of the piping (%>%) operator
- Data wrangling in tidyverse. How to tidy a dataset.
- Data visualization using ggplot2. Colour and shapes in ggplot2 graphs. Fine-tuning of graphs.
- How to manage date in R. String manipulation and date manipulation. Use of lubridate and stringer.
- Pivot_longer and pivot_wider how to use them for tidying a dataset.
- For, while, if and then commands.
- Descriptive statistics. Probability distributions. Confidence intervals and statistical inference. Confidence intervals, *t-tests*, *p* values. Monte Carlo Simulation.
- Regression analysis with R. Cross-sectional data and time-series data.
- Inbuilt datasets of R will be used for most of the topics.
- Rmarkdown. How to create a report using Rmd. Knitting of doc, HTML documents using the Rmd. Creating presentations using Rmarkdown.
- Github. Version control.
- NSS datasets and how to use R to analyze such big data sets.
- How to search for solutions using google.

Duration

The certificate course will be of 30 hours duration. There will be 2 hours of live online sessions (4-6 pm) every day for 15 days over Zoom.

Eligibility

It is open to any regular student of University of Delhi. The student should have a computer or a laptop with an internet facility. Basic knowledge of statistics is desirable. Certificates will be awarded to only those participants who will be present in all the online sessions. Participants are required to attempt all the quizzes.

Trajectories of Popular Culture and Globalization

A Report

The Department of English organized a short-term online course on "**Trajectories of Popular Culture and Globalization**" which was open for students, research scholars and teachers from colleges and universities of India. This course was designed to create critical literacy about new expressions of popular culture. The course enabled the participants to understand the shifts in the imaginaries amongst the youth in India, particularly in relation to gender, nation, culture and the category of otherness. The objective of the course was to create smart and critical consumers, creators and participants of popular culture. The course equipped the participants with domain knowledge and skills to go in for film appreciation, advertising industry, media and journalism. We covered all the major aspects and forms of popular culture.

Duration

The certificate course was of 30-hours duration. There were 3-hours of live online sessions every day for 10 days over Google Meet. The sessions were held from 27th September 2021-8th October, 2021. The Inaugural session was addressed by Professor Raj Kumar. Our principal, Professor Krishna Sharma, addressed the participants in the valedictory session. Six students shared their experiences of attending the course in the valedictory session.

Course Fee

A registration fee of Rs. 300/- was taken from each participant. Sixty participants registered for the course.
