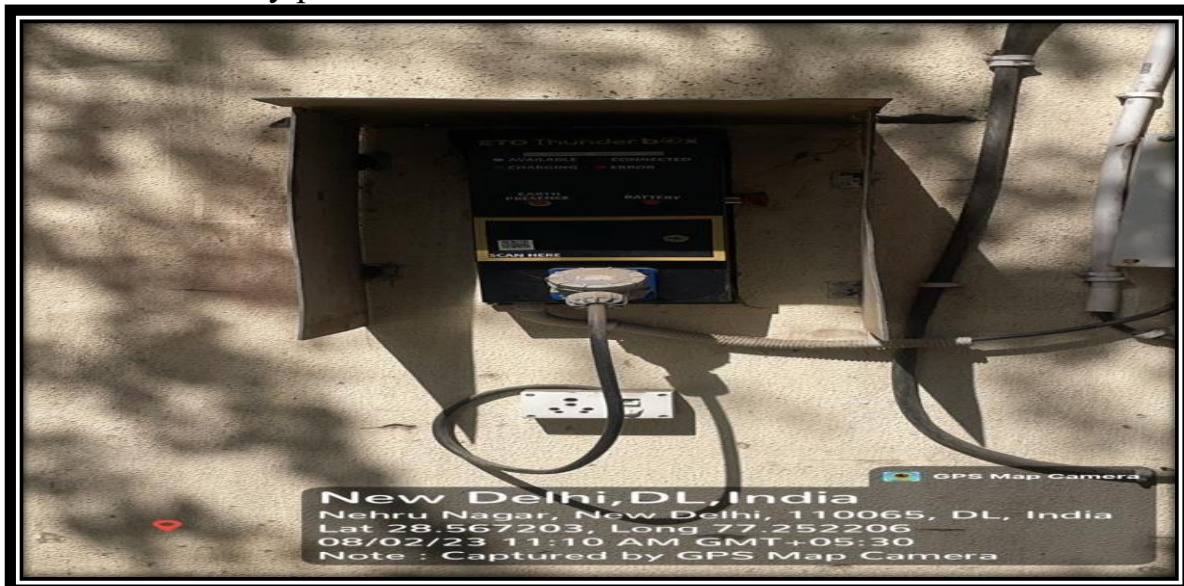
We kindly request everyone's cooperation in adhering to this updated policy. It is vital to create a safe and accessible campus environment for all members of our college community.

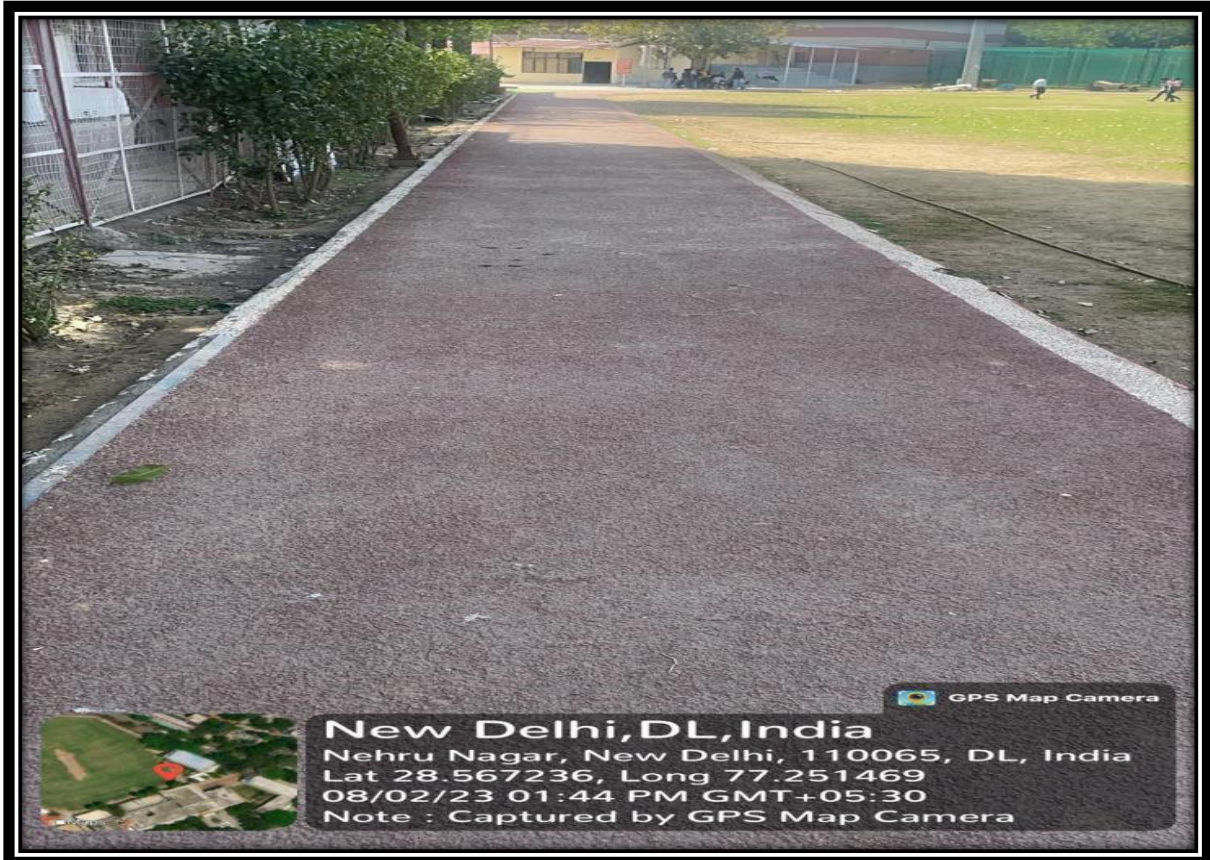
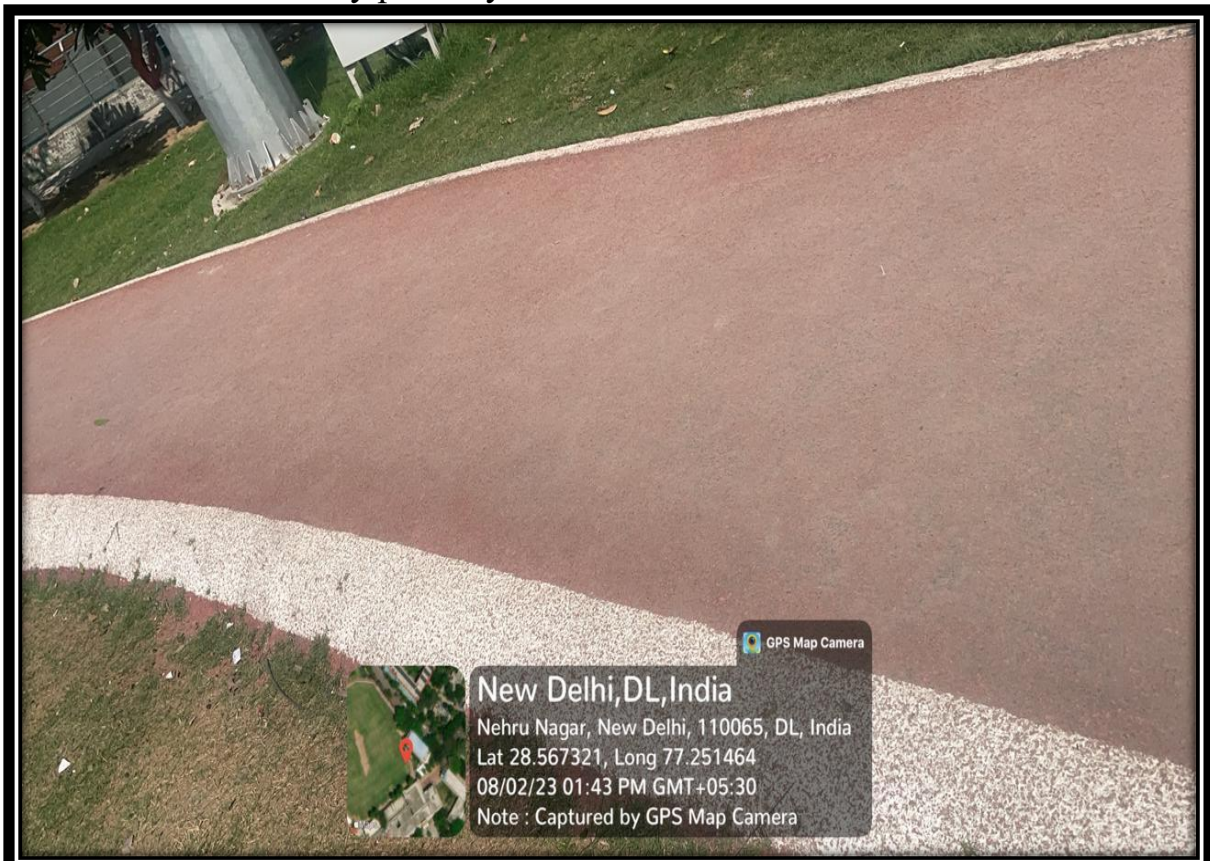
