India has a total number of seventy-five Ramsar sites covering an area of 13,26,677 ha. Tamil Nadu has the maximum number of Ramsar sites (14) followed by Uttar Pradesh (10). Not only this, but he also spelled out the qualifying criteria to be a Ramsar site.

Report on Meme Making Competition

Report on Distribution of masks to Rag pickers

As part of the National Service Scheme (NSS), the students of PGDAV College participated in a social service project to distribute masks to rag pickers working with New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) in 2020-21. The project aimed to protect the health and safety of the rag pickers, who are exposed to various hazards and infections while collecting and sorting waste materials. The project also sought to raise awareness and appreciation for the valuable contribution of the rag pickers to the solid waste management system of the city. The students procured N-95 masks from a reliable source and distributed them to the rag pickers in different zones of NDMC. They also interacted with the rag pickers and educated them about the importance of wearing protective equipment and maintaining social distancing to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other diseases. The project was a success as it reached out to more than 200 rag pickers and provided them with essential protective gear. It also helped to create a positive image of the rag pickers in the society and to acknowledge their role in keeping the city clean and green. Report on Donation Drive for Flood Victims

Report on Disaster Management Training and Awareness

It was also covered by some local media outlets and was a successful initiative by the NSS unit of the college to promote the culture of disaster resilience among the college community.

Report on CPR Training

The cardiopulmonary resuscitation training was held and the 25th MTNL Perfect Health Mela was a five-day event that showcased various aspects of health and wellness, such as yoga, meditation, Ayurveda, homeopathy, and allopathy. Aggarwal, the president of HCFI, who demonstrated the steps of CPR on a mannequin and encouraged the participants to practice the same. It also covered the topics of heart attack, stroke, and choking, and how to prevent and manage them. It was attended by hundreds of people, including students, teachers, and general public, who learned the importance of CPR and how to perform it in an emergency situation. It was a part of the ongoing campaign of HCFI and NSS PGDAV to create a mass movement of CPR 10, which aims to train at least 10% of the population in CPR.
