The College

Courses Offered & Distribution of Seats

Undergraduate Programs

PGDAV College is a constituent college of the University of Delhi. The academic curriculum is adopted and used as is approved by the University of Delhi. The Undergraduate courses on offer fall under the purview of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, adopted by the University of Delhi.

The NEP 2020 envisages imparting academic knowledge, technical and professional-skills as well as life-skills as part of the vision of holistic education at tertiary level in India. In addition to the academically rigorous Discipline Centric Electives and Generic Electives (GE), the University of Delhi has also augmented the curricula with Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value Addition Courses (VAC) in various subject domains.

Skill Enhancement Courses aim to provide students with a wide variety of skills, such as communication, coding, financial literacy, to name a few. The curricula incorporate hands-on-learning so that the students get adequate training for the professional path they may choose. The Value Addition Courses intend to impart a sound value system and nurture an indispensable ethical base in the developmental trajectory of the youth.

Application & Admission Process

Admission Procedure

Admissions to all UG Programmes in the college are done strictly on the basis of the eligibility requirements, criteria, and procedures specified by the University of Delhi on its website. The entire admission process is online. Students may find the Undergraduate Bulletin of Information - 2025 (UG-BOI '25) at the following link:

The student is solely responsible for regularly checking the Delhi University Admission Portal for updates, guidelines, schedules, and admission-related policies. They are advised to check their dashboard, email, and admission website (https://admission.uod.ac.in/) for all communications and updates related to admissions.

Candidates seeking admission under the Foreign Students' category are required to apply on Foreign Students' Registry website: http://fsr.du.ac.in

Admission Process in College

- 1. Under the system of Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS 25), after having been provisionally allocated a seat for a course in a college, the candidate is required to 'accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat. Once he does so, the college will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:
 - i. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate
 - ii. Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate
- iii. Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- iv. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.
- 2. After the verification, the college will either 'approve' or 'reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate. Once the college accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the admission fee for the approved seat.
- 3. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee. If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2025 allocation rounds.
- 4. Admission fee on account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate will be refunded completely only if the withdrawal has been made before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. Admission fees for withdrawals done after the last date of admission will not be refunded in any circumstance. Refunds will not be done for the CSAS-2025 Application Fee, Mid-Entry Fee and Withdrawal Fee.
- 5. At the conclusion of CSAS-2025, all admitted candidates would have to report to the college and complete all the admission formalities of the college, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.

Note:

Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the college. If at any stage, the original documents related to a candidate's admission are found to be fake/non-genuine or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the concerned candidate will not be admitted and if already admitted, admission will be cancelled without any prior notice in this regard. No fee shall be refunded in such cases. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to any UG Program of University of Delhi for the Academic Session 2025-26. If the same is found after completing the course, the candidate's degree will be cancelled and appropriate legal action will be taken against him/her.

Admission on Extra-Curricular Activities and Sports (Supernumerary Quota)

- 1. Candidates can apply for a maximum of three ECA categories. However, admission will be offered in only one category.
- 2. For each ECA category in which the candidate is applying, s(he) must upload a maximum of Best Five certificates of the preceding four years, issued between the time period of 1st May 2022 30th April 2025.
- 3. Before applying, the candidates are advised to refer to the college-wise ECA seat matrix and the availability of ECA categories/sub-categories in various colleges (published on <u>admission.uod.ac.in</u>).
- 4. Allocations to ECA Supernumerary quota for all colleges is through the Central ECA Admission Committee of the University of Delhi.
- 5. For admissions under ECA Supernumerary quota, a candidate's Combined ECA Merit (CEM) score will be considered. The CEM score of a candidate will be the summation of 25% of the highest Program-Specific CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which s(he) has applied and 75% of the highest ECA score obtained from the ECA categories for which the candidate is being considered.
- 6. The maximum marks for ECA score shall be 75, comprising performance in physical trials and/or uploaded certificates, as applicable.
- 7. For an ECA score of 75 marks, for all 12 categories (except NCC and NSS), 60 marks shall be awarded on the basis of physical trials and 15 marks shall be awarded on the basis of the submitted certificates.
- 8. In the award of scores for performance in physical trials, the discretion of judges will be final and binding.
- 9. For all guidelines related to admission in Supernumerary Quota, candidates may go through Chapter 22 of UGC-CSAS 2025, which can be accessed from the link given at: https://admission.uod.ac.in/userfiles/downloads/18062025 CSAS-UG compressed.pdf

Note:

A student once admitted on the basis of Sports is required to give an Undertaking in writing on judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100, that she/he will make herself/himself available for regular practice sessions as called for, by the College/University Sports Authorities, and if selected to any College/University team, she/he will represent the College/University team and abide by the rules and regulations pertaining to sports persons in all the years during her/his undergraduate course, failing which the college has the right to cancel the admission of the candidate anytime during the entire duration of the course of study.

Admission On the Basis of Excellence in Extracurricular Activities (ECA) in PGDAV College

The college will follow the admission guidelines as issued by the University of Delhi.

In University of Delhi, admission through the ECA quota for the academic year 2025- 26 will be done in 14 ECA Categories. However, admission to those categories and subcategories is subject to those categories being offered by the colleges, as shall be reflected in the ECA seat matrix (published on admission.uod.ac.in).

For the availability of seats in various ECA activities, candidates are required to visit the University of Delhi Admission website.

All candidates seeking admission through ECA Supernumerary quota will have to mandatorily submit an Undertaking in writing on judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100, at the time of admission, stating that for the entire period of their undergraduate study, they will participate in the activities for the college/University under the ECA category for which s/he has been admitted in the college, failing which the college has the right to cancel the admission of the candidate anytime during the entire duration of the course of study.

Candidates are required to check the UoD Admission Website regularly for all admission-related information under the supernumerary seats. The details and schedule of physical trials (wherever applicable) and other additional information for the aforesaid admissions 2025-26 will be notified there only.

List of Documents Required at the Time of Admission

- 1. The Candidates shall be required to produce the same certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the college, that were uploaded on the admission portal at the time of applying.
- 2. Class X Certificate in the name of the candidate, indicating date of birth and parent names.
- 3. Class XII Marksheet in the name of the candidate. The name of the candidate must match with the CUET(UG)-2025 form.
- 4. SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD must match the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG)-2025. Similarly, his/her parent names must match in both sets of certificates.
- 5. OBC Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) specifically mentioning the non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the competent issuing authority, wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by http://ncbc.nic.in. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under OBC -Non- Creamy Layer must match with the name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) 2025. Similarly, parent names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2025.
- 6. EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority. The name of the candidate claiming reservation must match with the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate. Similarly, his/her parent names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2025.
- 7. Candidates claiming admission through ECA/Sports supernumerary quota must upload self-attested copies of the requisite certificates and produce the relevant required certificates when sought.
- 8. PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate, issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a duly attested photograph of the candidate. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.
- 9. Candidates applying for the Children/Widow of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW) category must possess the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) in the prescribed format, issued by the prescribed authorities only (For information, refer to DU-UG BOI'25) wherein the priority is clearly mentioned.
- 10. Candidates applying for the Kashmiri Migrant category must upload the relevant certification in the correct format issued by Divisional / Relief Commissioner.
- 11. Candidates who wish to seek admission under University of Delhi Ward supernumerary quota must upload a valid employment certificate of his/her parent/s issued by the due officials. Only the employment certificate uploaded in CSAS(UG)-2025 application form will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.
- 12. An anti-ragging undertaking has to be given by both the student and her/his parent/Guardian.

Department of Mathematics

Infrastructure and Facilities

The college meets the latest infrastructural requirements among the colleges of University of Delhi. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled. The college has added smart classrooms equipped with overhead projectors and separate departmental rooms. The facility of QR codes is provided outside the classrooms and departmental rooms. It has an RO water system. In our endeavour to promote ecological sustenance, the campus is fully equipped with a rainwater harvesting system, beautiful lawns and herbal gardens. The college displays a unique balance between using modern technology and imperatives of a sustainable environment.

Library



PGDAV College library has a very rich collection of one lakh four thousand books on various subjects and disciplines including reference books, general books and text books. It subscribes to around 60 periodicals and 19 newspapers for the knowledge and pleasure of reading for the students and faculties alike. We aim to provide a comfortable and peaceful reading ambience that helps students to enhance their concentration while studying for long hours. The library is fully computerized, air-conditioned and Wi-Fi enabled with High-tech CCTV surveillance to ensure a conducive and pleasurable reading environment. The library offers various services to its users like Membership, Circulation, Reference, OPAC, Book Bank, Article Alert and Reprographic Services. To check the availability of books in the library from remote places, WEB OPAC services have been initiated. The recent initiative of the Library provides free access to both conventional as well as electronic resources like N-LIST, DELNET and Delhi University Library System(DULS) e-resources to its registered users. The remote log facility is provided to students and faculty members of the college.

Newly developed E-library with 23 terminals is dedicated to students of the college which facilitates smooth downloading and free access of e-books, e-journals and other academic resources. The College library has reshaped the Reference Section into Reference-cum-Conference room. The section is embellished with comfortable furniture, latest ICT facilities for conducting orientation programmes, short term courses and other educational activities for the holistic development of the students and teachers.

Conducting library orientation programmes, awareness about open educational resources, organizing book fairs is a regular feature of our college library. It is accessible on all working days to all students and staff members of the college. Each student is offered library membership at the time of admission. College ID card is provided after the students get registered in the record of the library.

Library Rules

- All students of the college are issued a college ID card from the library once the fees are deposited. Students are required to register themselves in the library showing their fee slip.
- Library membership and tickets will be offered on being registered.
- Library membership is valid till the student is on the college rolls.
- Each Undergraduate student is entitled to borrow four books at a time for a period of fourteen days.
- Each Postgraduate student is entitled to borrow five books at a time for a period of fourteen days.
- Economically weaker but bright students are issued five books per semester from the Book Bank section (at no additional cost) after applying through a proper channel.
- Students who return books later than the due date will be liable to pay fine.
- Reference sources and books kept under the Reference Section of the library will not be issued and are only for reading in the library.
- Handle the library resources carefully.
- Use of mobile phones in the library is strictly prohibited.

Facilities for Differently Abled and Meritorious Students

College library extends support to needy students through a book bank facility. Needy and meritorious students can borrow five books for the entire semester related to their course without any additional cost. Library supports its differently-abled students through various assistive devices and technology. We have a

dedicated lab for accessing Braille library resources, Sugamya Pustakalaya and reading & recording of other resources for visually impaired students. Students are assisted in learning and reading through various softwares like JAWS and devices like ANGEL DAISY Reader, MP3 Recorder, Net Books, Zoom Ex Instant Text Reader, Orbit Reader, Kibo, Lex Portable Camera etc.

Computer Laboratories - Internet and Intranet Facilities

The college has a well-equipped, air-conditioned state-of-the-art Environmental Science laboratory to carry out experiments and for practical training of students in the subject.


Auditorium and Seminar Hall

Students' Union

Each student of PGDAV College is a member of the Students' Union in the college. The principal is the patron of the Students' Union. The Students' Union is affiliated to the Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU). Equal Opportunity Cell and Enabling Unit

Enactus-PGDAV is an international non-profit organization that works with the leaders in business and higher education to mobilize university students to make a difference in their communities through projects, empower the underprivileged communities, create entrepreneurs out of them, and give them the opportunity to gain experience and skills to build a successful career. It is a path towards sustainable progress for underprivileged people and their communities. In order to nurture the cause of upliftment and empowerment of the marginalized communities, team ENACTUS PGDAV collaborates with Shakti Shalini, an NGO dedicated to advancing gender equality and women empowerment since 1987. The team along with the members of the NGO carry out the work at Kushalta Vikas Kendra (KVK), which is the shelter home of Shakti Shalini.

Currently we have four projects running under Enactus PGDAV:

Project Korakagaz – This project was started in 2015 with the aim of uplifting women of marginalized sections by training them to become entrepreneurs in the stationery business. The project also provides them with regular wages for their livelihood. Project Korakagaz has also produced an independent entrepreneur from KVK, who has launched her independent brand, Abhilasha.

Project Nistaaran – In February 2020, Enactus PGDAV launched Project Nistaaran, an intiative to uplift the community of waste pickers by engaging them in production and marketing of chemical free non- toxic compost and bioenzymes from urban solid waste. These bioenzymes act as multipurpose cleaners as well as fertilizers which are a replacement of toxic chemical loaded cleaners in the market. Project Nistaaran also helps in reducing the greenhouse gas emissions by giving a feasible and cost-effective alternative to landfills.

Project Sugandh – In February 2020, Enactus PGDAV launched Project Sugandh, an initiative to protect people from malicious health problems and nurture the environment by providing charcoal free non-toxic and eco-friendly incense cones made out of waste flowers from temples and decorations. The project also aims at uplifting deprived communities.

General Rules

1. Attendance

- Minimum attendance as required under the University rules for lectures, tutorials, practicals etc. must be obtained by each student.
- Special concessions as per university rules are given to students of NCC, NSS, ECA, Sports and other co-curricular and extra-curricular bodies.
- Students are advised to periodically check their attendance records with their teachers and on college website.
- Benefit of medical leave is available only if the required medical and fitness certificates are submitted within seven days of joining the college.
- 2. **Internal Assessment:** Periodic tests and assignments are compulsory, as they are a part of Internal Assessment scores, as stipulated by the university. The breakup of Internal Assessment is as follows:
 - Written Assignment / Tutorials/Project Reports / Test Papers/ Presentations/ Practicals
 - Continuous Assessment
 - Attendance (For details see University rules)
 - In addition, Continuous Evaluation as stipulated for NEP, as per the guidelines of University of Delhi.
- 3. **Free Periods:** These are to be utilised for study in the reading room and library.
- 4. **Cleanliness:** College premises must be kept free of litter.
- 5. **Identity Card:** Students must carry their Identity Card. They will not be entertained by the office staff unless they show their Identity Card. Furthermore, a student may be asked to show their Identity Card by any member of the college staff.
- 6. Entry to the college is strictly prohibited to outsiders. Any unauthorised person found on the college campus shall be dealt with strictly and will be handed over to the police.
- 7. Students must make it a habit to see the Notice Board and college website regularly for the latest communications.

- 8. Smoking and consumption of intoxicants by the students on the premises of the college are strictly prohibited and a punishable offence. Delhi University, in cooperation with Delhi Police and World Lung Foundation, South Asia, promotes a tobacco-free environment by banning smoking in the college.
- 9. Any information desired from the office should be sought at the respective counters of the office.
- 10. **Staff Room:** The staff room is strictly for use by the teaching staff of the college. Students are not to loiter around or enter the staff room without permission.
- 11. Students are free to meet the principal for redressal of their grievances between 11:00 am and 12:00 noon on all working days.
- 12. Students must switch off their mobile phones before entering the class. If a mobile phone is found to be active, a fine of Rs. five hundred shall be imposed. Students will be penalised, if they use mobile phones for communication, including SMS/MMS or any other form of entertainment in the classroom, library and labs.
- 13. Only the students of II and III years can contest elections for posts of office bearers of the college Students' Union, provided they have cleared all papers and have secured at least 50% marks in the university examinations and have 75% attendance in the preceding year.
- 14. Students who invite disciplinary action against them will not be eligible for special recognition from college which includes prizes, scholarships, financial assistance, and sports certificates.
- 15. All PGDAVians are required to behave in a professional manner at all times. This includes speaking in a quiet voice, being silent in quiet areas like the library and major hallways, and showing general respect for teachers, staff, and *karamcharis* across all college locations.
- 16. The college has the mandatory provision for RTI and Internal Complaints Committee (ICC).
- 17. The college adopts a Zero Tolerance Policy towards Sexual Harassment.
