#### Location

#### **Facilities**

The College meets the latest infrastructural requirements. The Campus is Wi-Fi enabled and students have access to a fully functional Computer Hub to access the internet and various Delhi University Library System resources. The College has added smart classrooms equipped with overhead projectors and separate departmental rooms. It has a grand auditorium and state-of-the-art seminar halls. A lift facility for the differently-abled students is also provided. The College has on its premises a branch of the Central Bank of India. The College has an RO water system. The Canteen is one of the largest in the University, serving a variety of cuisines. The College also has a photostat kiosk. It has a fitness centre. The College offers medical facilities with a doctor and a nurse available for the students. During the tough Covid times, RTPCR test facility and a vaccination centre were also made available to our students and staff. The NEP 2020 envisages imparting academic knowledge, technical and professional skills as well as life skills as part of holistic education. In addition to these, there are Value Added Courses (VAC) to impart a sound value system to the youth.

#### **General Information**

- 1. The candidate is responsible for regularly checking the admission website of University of Delhi (UoD) for updates, guidelines, schedules, and admission-related policies.
- 2. For notifications and updates regarding Under-Graduate (UG) Admissions-2022, please visit www.admission.uod.ac.in
- 3. Admissions to all UG Programs are done on the basis of the eligibility requirements, criteria, and procedures specified by the University on its website, Under-Graduate Bulletin of Information 2022 (UG-BOI) and Common Seat Allocation System-2022 (CSAS).
- 4. The Ordinances, Rules, Regulations, and Notifications of the UoD available on the University website, www.du.ac.in shall be final and binding.
- 5. For the academic year 2022-23, admission to all UG Programs of UoD will be done on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test- Under-Graduate 2022 (CUET (UG) 2022).
- 6. Only the candidate who has appeared in CUET(UG) 2022 and has passed Class XIIth from a single recognized board will be eligible to apply for the CSAS-2022.
- 7. Candidates applying to UoD must refer to the UG BoI-2022 for Common Minimum Eligibility criteria and Program-Specific Eligibility criteria. (http://du.ac.in/uploads/new-web/21042022\_BOI-UG.pdf).
- 8. Candidates are advised to check their dashboard, email, and admission website (www.admission.uod.ac.in) for all communications and updates related to admissions.
- 9. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories (including PwBD, CW, and KM). Candidates applying under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/ CW/PwBD/KM categories will be required to upload the certificates/documents of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the Competent Issuing Authority.
- 10. If at any stage, documents submitted by the candidate relating to the admission are found to be fake/non-genuine and/or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the said candidate will not be given admission and if already admitted, admission will be canceled without any prior notice in this regard. If the same is found after completing the Program, his/her degree will be revoked and appropriate legal action will be taken against him/her.
- 11. A candidate's participation in the admission process will be provisional. If, at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be canceled ipso facto and appropriate legal action will be taken against such candidate
- 12. University will not refund Admission Fee in case any candidate is found ineligible at a later stage.
- 13. Gap year will not be a bar for purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET-2022 for admissions in academic year-2022.

14. Candidates seeking admission under the Foreign Students' category are required to apply on Foreign Students' Registry website: http://fsr.du.ac.in

#### Information about Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS-2022)

- 1. Admission to all UG Programs of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23 will be through CSAS-2022, based on the eligibility requirements stated in UG BOI-2022 and other rules as published by the University of Delhi on its website.
- 2. An online platform at www.admission.uod.ac.in will be made available for seeking admission through CSAS-2022. Candidates seeking admission to UoD must fill the CSAS-2022 Application Form online through this platform only. There will be no offline filling of the CSAS-2022 Application Form.
- 3. The Common Seat Allocation System 2022 is divided in Three Phases:
  PHASE I: APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY OF DELHI
  PHASE II: FILLING THE PREFERENCES FOR PROGRAMS AND COLLEGES
  PHASE III: ALLOCATION-CUM-ADMISSION
- 4. No undertaking in lieu of incomplete/non-availability of certificates/documents will be accepted.

#### Online Approval by the College

- 1. Once the candidate "Accepts" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the College will check the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate. The College will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:
  - a) Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
  - b) Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate.
  - c) Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
  - $\label{eq:continuous} \textbf{Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.}$
- 2. During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate. During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.
- 3. After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate.
  - Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee' for the approved seat.
- 4. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee. If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds. The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds.

- Admission Fee on account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate will be refunded completely only if the withdrawal has been made before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. Admission fees for withdrawals done after the last date of admission will not be refunded in any circumstance. Refunds will not be done for the following:
  - a) CSAS-2022 Application Fee.
  - b) Mid-Entry Fee.
  - c) Withdrawal Fee.
- 6. At the conclusion of CSAS-2022, all admitted candidates would have to report to the admitted College and complete all the admission formalities of the concerned College, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.
- 7. Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the respective College. The College will recheck all the documents/certificates. During physical verification, if any document/certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to any UG Program of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23.

#### Admission through Extra-Curricular Activities

- 1. Candidate can apply for a maximum of three ECA categories. However, admission will be offered in only one category.
- 2. For each ECA category in which the candidate is applying, s(he) must upload a maximum of Best Five certificates of the preceding five years, issued between the time period of 1st April 2017 30th June 2022.
- 3. Before applying, the candidates are advised to refer to the College-wise ECA seat matrix and the availability of ECA categories/sub-categories in various Colleges (published on admission.uod.ac.in).
- 4. Allocation to ECA Supernumerary quota for all Colleges is through the Central ECA Admission Committee of the University.
- 5. For admissions under the ECA Supernumerary quota, a candidate's Combined ECA Merit (CEM) score will be considered. The CEM score of a candidate will be the summation of 25% of the highest Program-Specific CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which s(he) has applied and 75% of the highest ECA score obtained from the ECA categories for which the candidate is being considered.
- 6. The maximum marks for ECA score shall be 75, comprising performance in physical trials and/or uploaded certificates, as applicable.
- 7. For an ECA score of 75 marks, for all 12 categories (except NCC and NSS), 60 marks shall be awarded on the basis of physical trials and 15 marks shall be awarded on the basis of the submitted certificates.
- 8. In the award of scores for performance in physical trials, the discretion of judges will be final and binding.

- 9. All candidates seeking admission through ECA Supernumerary quota will have to mandatorily submit an Undertaking at the time of admission, stating that for the entire period of their Under-Graduation study, they shall participate in the activities for the College and the University under the ECA category for which s/he has been admitted in the College, failing which the College has the right to cancel the admission of the candidate anytime during the entire duration of the course of study.
- 10. The College-wise ECA seat matrix, details and schedule of physical trials (wherever applicable), and other additional information for the ECA admissions 2022-23 will be notified on the UoD Admission website. The candidates must keep checking the website regularly for all admission-related information under the ECA Quota.

#### List of Documents at the Time of Applying

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of relevant certificates/documents at the time of applying (as applicable) and produce the same certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the College.

- 1. Class X Certificate in the name of the candidate, indicating date of birth and Parents' names.
- 2. Class XII Marksheet in the name of the candidate. The name of the candidate must match with the CUET(UG)-2022 form.
- 3. SC / ST / OBC-NCL / EWS / Minority / CW / KM / PwBD Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority. The name of candidate claiming reservation under SC / ST / OBC-NCL / EWS / Minority / CW / KM / PwBD must match the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) 2022. Similarly, his/her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates.
- 4. OBC Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by http://ncbc.nic.in. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under OBC -Non-Creamy Layer must match with the name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) 2022; similarly, the parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022. The prescribed format of the OBC-NCL certificate is given on the UoD admission website and Annexure IV.
- 5. EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under this category must match with the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate; similarly, his/her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022. Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate.
- 6. Candidates claiming admission through ECA/Sports supernumerary quota must upload self-attested copies of the requisite certificates and produce the relevant required certificates when sought.

- 7. PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate (Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate). Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.
- 8. Candidates applying for the CW category must upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC), (in the name of the candidate) in the prescribed format wherein the Priority is clearly mentioned. Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate.
- 9. Candidates applying for the Kashmiri Migrant category must upload the relevant certification in the correct format issued by Divisional / Relief Commissioner.
- 10. Candidates who wish to seek admission under UoD Ward supernumerary quota must upload a valid employment certificate of his/her parent/s issued by the due officials. Only the employment certificate uploaded in CSAS Application form will be considered. Icards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

A student once admitted on the basis of Sports is required to give an undertaking in writing on judicial stamp paper of Rs 100, that she/he will make herself/himself available for regular practice sessions as called for by the College/ University Sports Authorities, and if selected to any College/ University team, she/he will represent the College/University team and abide by the rules and regulations pertaining to sports persons in all the years during her/his undergraduate course.

A student once admitted on the basis of ECA is required to give an undertaking in writing that she/he will participate in their respective activity throughout their stay in the College, failing which, their admission is liable to be cancelled.

#### Library

PGDAV College library has a very rich collection of more than one lakh books on various subjects and disciplines. It subscribes to around 65 periodicals and 17 newspapers for the reading pleasure of students and faculty alike. We strive to provide a comfortable and peaceful reading ambience for our users that aims to ensure concentration while studying for long hours. Thus the library is fully computerized, air-conditioned and Wi-Fi enabled with High Tech CCTV surveillance to ensure a conducive and pleasurable reading environment. The library offers various services to its users like Membership, Circulation, Reference, OPAC, Book Bank, Article Alert and Reprographic Services. Library provides free access to both conventional as well as electronic resources like N LIST and Delhi University Library System e resources to its registered users. The remote log facility is provided to PG students and faculty members of the college.

A newly developed E library with 23 terminals is dedicated to students of the college facilitating free access and downloading of e books, e journals and other academic resources. The library has reshaped the Reference Section into Reference cum Conference room. This section is embellished with comfortable furniture, latest ICT facilities for conducting orientation programmes, short term courses and other educational activities.

Conducting library orientation programmes, awareness about open educational resources, organizing book fairs is a regular feature of our college library. The library is accessible from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday to Saturday (working days) to all student members and staff of the College. Each student is offered library membership at the time of admission. College ID card is provided after the students get registered in the record of the library.

#### Library Rules

- All students of the college are issued a College ID card from the library once they have deposited the fees. Students are required to register themselves in the library showing their fee slip.
- · Library membership and tickets will be offered on being registered.
- · Library membership is valid till the student is on college rolls.
- Each Undergraduate student is entitled to borrow four books at a time for a period of fourteen days.
- Each Postgraduate student is entitled to borrow five books at a time for a period of fourteen days.
- Economically weaker but bright students are issued five books per semester from the Book Bank section (at no additional cost) after applying through a proper channel.
- Students who return books later than the due date will be liable to pay a fine.
- Reference sources and books kept under the Reference Section of the Library will not be issued and are only for reading in the library.
- Students are advised to handle the library resources carefully.
- Use of mobile phones in the library is strictly prohibited.

#### Facilities for Differently Abled and Meritorious Students

College Library extends support to needy students through the book bank facility. Needy and meritorious students can borrow five books for the entire semester related to their course without any additional cost. Library supports its differently abled students through various assistive devices and technology. We have a dedicated lab for accessing Braille library resources, Sugamya Pustakalaya and reading and recording of other resources for visually impaired students. Students are assisted in learning and reading through various softwares like JAWS and devices like ANGEL DAISY Reader, MP3 recorder, Net books, Zoom Ex Instant Text Reader, Lex Portable Camera etc.

#### Computer Hub

The College has a fully functional and well-equipped computer hub with access to the Internet and Delhi University Library System. There are five computer labs and one Statistics lab with about 220 computers in all. All the computers are on Ethernet LAN, and the campus is Wi-Fi enabled. For subject requirements, various licensed as well as open-source software and platforms like Linux, Oracle, Android platform, MySQL give our students a hands-on experience of the latest technology.

#### Seminar Hall

The College takes pride in having very well equipped, fully air-conditioned and acoustically well-maintained Seminar Halls for academic and cultural activities. They are the venues for lectures, debates, discussions, and workshops where eminent speakers are invited.

#### College Canteen

The College has a spacious, well-furnished canteen, offering a wide variety of fresh and hygienically prepared food at subsidised rates. It is one of the largest canteens at the University of Delhi.

#### Bank

The College has a branch of the Central Bank of India on its premises. The timings are 10 AM to 4:45 PM.

#### **Medical Facilities**

The College has a medical room that provides first-aid assistance. Dr. Neena Paul is available during specific hours. A full-time nurse is also available in the College. The Medical room has a vending machine for the convenience of girl students.

#### Academic Societies

All the Departments in the college have academic societies which organise events like seminars, workshops, debates, lectures by distinguished academicians, researchers and

#### Placement Cell

The Placement Cell acts as a bridge between recruiters and fresh talent that our college nurtures every year. With 'Your Ambition, Our Aim' as our motto, we strive to provide our students with a variety of resources and opportunities for honing their skills and knowledge base, as well as the professional etiquettes essential to flourish in the corporate career. Because of our constant efforts, PGDAV has been a preferred destination for a large number of reputed companies for recruitment.

We place significant importance on our relationship with recruiters and are persistent in our commitment to make their recruitment experience successful and rewarding. Opportunities for placements and internships have been overwhelming in the past sessions and our aim is to increase these opportunities in the upcoming sessions.

Over 120 companies recruited from our campus with 140+ students placed at renowned companies. Deloitte, EY, DE Shaw Group, JustDial, upGrad, Bank of America, ICICI Bank, Infosys, unacademy, Chegg, HCL, Vivo, Puma have been among the major recruiters. The highest package went up to INR 23 LPA and the average package was INR 5.86 LPA. The highest stipend stands at INR 1.25 Lakh per month and the average stipend has been INR 8,000 per month.

The cell has taken various initiatives for the development of students, including CV vetting, BYPL Scholarship- where each selected student was offered 30,000 rupees and "Hear from the Alumni" blog to inform the students about the success stories of professionals. A plethora of webinars giving a sneak peek of the corporate world and its function is organised regularly to awaken the zeal of the students. Hyperion also successfully organized events on the occasion of Voters' Day, January 25th, 2022, through various online events like public speaking and poster making competitions.





Currently we have four projects running under Enactus PGDAV – Project Korakagaz, Project Nistaran, Project Sugandh and Project Hope. In order to nurture the cause of upliftment and empowerment of the marginalised communities, team ENACTUS PGDAV collaborates with Shakti Shalini, an NGO dedicated to advancing gender equality and women empowerment since 1987. The team along with four members of the NGO carry out the work at Kushalta Vikas Kendra(KVK), which is the shelter home of Shakti Shalini. In addition to this we have associated ourselves with two other NGOs namely NOW (New Opportunities for Women), Srinivaspuri, New Delhi and ASHRAY, Jangpura, New Delhi.

**Project Korakagaz** – This project was started in 2015 with the aim of uplifting women of marginalised sections by training them to become entrepreneurs in the stationery business. The project also provides them with regular wages for their livelihood.

**Project Nistaaran** – In February 2020, Enactus PGDAV launched Project Nistaaran, an intiative to uplift the community of waste pickers by engaging them in production and marketing of compost and bioenzymes from urban solid waste. Project Nistaaran also helps in reducing the greenhouse gas emissions by giving a feasible and cost effective alternative to landfills.

**Project Sugandh** – In February 2020, Enactus PGDAV launched Project Sugandh, an initiative to protect people from malicious health problems and nurture the environment by providing non toxic and eco friendly incense sticks. The project also aims at uplifting deprived communities.

**Project Hope** – Project Hope aims to enlighten the youth about how to safeguard their mental health and those of people around them.

We have come a long way in this journey of ours and hope to continue to achieve more goals.

# **General Rules**

#### 1. Attendance:

- Minimum attendance as required under the University rules for lectures, tutorials, preceptorials etc., must be obtained by each student.
- Special concessions as per University rules are given to students of NCC, NSS, ECA, Sports and other co-curricular and extra-curricular bodies.
- Students are advised to periodically check their attendance records with their teachers and on College website.
- Benefit of medical leave is available only if the required Medical and Fitness certificates are submitted within seven days of joining the College.
- 2. **Internal Assessment :** Periodic tests and assignments are compulsory, as they are a part of Internal Assessment scores, as stipulated by the University. The breakup of Internal Assessment is as follows:
  - Written Assignment/Tutorials/Project Reports/Test Papers/Seminars-10%
  - Class Test/Quiz-10%
  - Attendance (For details see University rules)-5%
- 3. **Free Periods:** These are to be utilised for study in the reading room and library.
- 4. **Cleanliness:** College premises must be kept free of litter.
- 5. **Identity Card**: Each student of the College shall always carry their Identity Card. They will not be entertained by the College office unless they show their Identity Card. Furthermore, a student may be asked to show their Identity Card by any member of the College staff. Defaulters shall be strictly dealt with as per rules.
- 6. The entry to the College is strictly prohibited to outsiders. Any unauthorised person found on the College campus shall be dealt with strictly and will be handed over to the police.
- 7. Students must make it a habit to see the Notice Board and College website regularly for the latest communications.
- 8. Smoking and consumption of intoxicants by the students on the premises of the College are strictly prohibited and are a punishable offence. Delhi University is partnering with Delhi Police and World Lung Foundation-South Asia to promote a tobacco-free environment. As a step in that direction, smoking is banned in the College.
- 9. Any information desired from the office should be sought at the respective counters of the office.
- 10. Students are expected not to loiter around aimlessly or make noise in the corridors/lobby. Students guilty of indiscipline will be penalised.
- 11. Staff Room: The staff room is strictly for use by the teaching staff of the College. Students are not to loiter around or enter the staff room without permission.
- 12. Students are free to meet the Principal for redressal of their grievances between 11 AM to 12 noon on all working days.
- 13. Students must switch off their mobile phones before entering the class. If mobile phone is found to be active, a fine of Rs. Five hundred shall be imposed. Students will be

- penalised, if they use cellphones for communication, including SMS/MMS or any other form of entertainment in the classroom, library and labs.
- 14. Only the students of II and III years can contest elections for posts of office bearers of the College Students' Union, provided they have cleared all papers and have secured at least 50% marks in the University examinations and have 75% attendance in the preceding year.
- 15. The College has the mandatory provision for RTI and Internal Complaints Committee (ICC).
- 16. No live singing performance by a celebrity stage artist (Star Night) would be allowed to be held in the College in any function organised by the students.

### **Anti-Ragging Regulation**

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited on the College premises.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under Ordinance XV-C of the University of Delhi.
- 3. Ragging for the purposes of this ordinarily means any act, conduct, or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear upon students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
  - a) involve physical assault or threat and/or use of physical force,
  - b) violate the dignity and honour of students.

## Maintenance of Discipline

The students are required to observe discipline in the College. As per Ordinance XV-B of the University, the following will constitute a breach of discipline:

- Assault or threat to use physical force against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi.
- · Carrying or use of, or threat to use any weapon.
- Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act 1976.
- Violation of dignity and honour of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.
- · Any practice, whether verbal or otherwise, derogatory to women.
- · Any attempt of bribing or corruption in any manner.
- $\bullet \quad \text{Destruction of institutional property}.$
- Creating ill-will on religious or communal grounds.
- Causing disruption of the academic functioning of the University system in any manner whatsoever.

The College campus has a wide CCTV camera network.


