### 2. Research Methodology

In the academic year 2022-23, a dedicated committee took the initiative to conduct a thorough Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS). The survey's primary aim was to assess the overall performance of our institution and gather valuable insights from our student community. The committee meticulously crafted a google questionnaire encompassing various aspects of the college's performance. To ensure maximum participation, students were notified through notices,

social media groups, Google Classroom, and other relevant platforms. The survey was conducted online, providing students with a convenient way to share their feedback. The approach successfully encouraged participation from a diverse group of students enrolled in various courses across the college, resulting in a substantial volume of responses.

The insights gathered through the Student Satisfaction Survey offer a comprehensive perspective of the students' view of the institution's overall performance during the academic year 2022-23. This feedback serves as a vital foundation for informed decision-making and the implementation of targeted improvements across various facets of the institution's operation. The diligent efforts of the feedback committee have ensured the successful execution of the Student Satisfaction Survey. The institution greatly values the participation and contribution of its students, as their insights play a pivotal role in shaping the continuous growth and development of the college. The following sections provide a detailed analysis of the survey's findings, shedding light on the students' perceptions of the institution's overall performance in the academic year 2022-23. The subsequent report aims to present a comprehensive overview of these findings and outline the steps the institution intends to take based on the feedback received.

Furthermore, to conduct a systematic and scientific analysis of the student satisfaction survey on the overall performance of the institution, a rigorous approach was adopted to convert students' responses into quantifiable measurements. The questionnaire consisted of a diverse set of questions, each addressing different aspects associated with the institution's overall performance. To ensure fairness and appropriate comparison, a uniform scale was developed. In this context, student responses, initially presented as percentages, were normalized to a common scale ranging from 0 to 4. This normalization process aimed to create a consistent basis for evaluating responses across all questions, and it was done using the following formula:

Normalized Score = (Student Percentage Response) × (Scale for Option) / 100

This formula facilitated the conversion of student responses into a standardized scale from 0 to 4, enabling direct comparison across different questions. The normalized score provided a numerical representation of students' sentiments on various aspects related to the institution's overall performance. By applying this normalization process, the institution aimed to systematically analyze the survey results, ensuring that all responses were evaluated on a standardized scale. This approach allowed for the identification of trends, strengths, and areas for improvement based on quantifiable data derived from the student satisfaction survey. The subsequent sections of the report will delve into the specific findings obtained through this analysis and outline the implications for enhancing the institution's performance.

## 3. Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey





#### 3.2 Graphical representation of Student Satisfaction Survey


Question wise graphical representation of students' responses to questions involving overall performance of the institution is illustrated in this section.



























































Thus, overall it can be concluded that 97% of the students either strongly agree, agree or agree to some extent that there is sufficient greenery.



27% of the students strongly agree that the college contributes adequately to nation building, whereas 36% of the students agree that the college contributes adequately to nation building. 25% of the students agree to some extent that the college contributes adequately to nation building. Thus, overall it can be concluded that 88% of the students either strongly agree, agree or agree to some extent that the college contributes adequately to nation building.



27% of the students strongly agree that the overall quality of teaching learning in the institute is good, whereas 40% of the students agree that the overall quality of teaching learning in the institute is good. 25% of the students agree to some extent that the overall quality of teaching learning in the institute is good. Thus, overall it can be concluded that 92% of the students either strongly agree, agree or agree to some extent that the overall quality of teaching learning in the institute is good.
